What is Dressember?

Dressember is an organization that helps fight against human trafficking by spreading awareness through its advocates who raise money, which goes to dressember's partner organizations. These organizations, IJM among others, help stop human trafficking and provide justice and relief for victims. For more information go to www.dressember.org.

What do I do on the team?

You can become a part of the Maine South Dressember Team by becoming an advocate on our page. Advocates are people who decide to take the Dressember challenge: wearing a dress or tie EVERY day of December!!! By doing this, they raise money for Dressember, and they get a lot of questions about why they dress so fancy, which is a perfect opportunity to advocate! If you decide to become an advocate, you will be given a pin that says "ask me about my dress or tie" (or both), and you will become a part of our team. We want as many people as possible to help advocate this year, and we would love to have you on our team! We only ask that by becoming an advocate, you acknowledge that our team is a safe space for everyone. We want to work and grow together, and therefore this is not a place for hateful speech or actions.

Do I need to own a lot of ties/dresses?

Absolutely not!!! In fact, many people who advocate for Dressember can easily do so with only 1 tie, or a few dresses. If you don't want to wear the same outfit every day, get creative with your few dresses/ties to have many different outfits/styles! If you want to buy dresses or ties for Dressember, secondhand shopping is a money-efficient and ethical option

How do I advocate when everything's online?

We might have to get creative this year, but the good news is we can use the technologies we have to our advantage. Fill up your insta, snapchat, or tik tok with news about Dressember and the link to donate. Also, don't be afraid to tell your in-person or Zoom classes about Dressember. Some of the might want to advocate too!!! Also, if anyone is having a hard time advocating, DM our insta or email us. We are all in this together and we would love to help you figure it out!

What is Human Trafficking?

Human trafficking, also known as modern-day slavery, is defined as a crime that involves exploiting a person for labor, services, or commercial sex. Victims are subject to intense labor without pay, and/or forced into the commercial sex industry. In most cases, they are very poorly treated or tricked by their traffickers. Human trafficking is prominent in all 50 states of the US, and all around the world. About 32,000 victims were recorded in the US in 2019 alone. This is far from the number of the people exploited throughout the world right now.

What can I do to help fight against human trafficking?

- 1 Become an Advocate for Dressember! This is the best way for you to directly help by raising money, and indirectly help by spreading the word.
- 2 Donate! Donate to our page (link at top of pdf) to help victims
- 3 Shop ethically! Most victims of labor trafficking are in the fashion industry for major fast-fashion companies. Make sure you buy clothes from a small business/ethical store or a secondhand store
- 4 Look on the dressember web page or instagram for more ways to help


