

News from Student and Family Services

Our 10th Grade students engaged in a brief survey called the Pediatric Symptoms Checklist (PSC) during advisory this week. Schools use the PSC as a universal screener, meaning students are surveyed to make sure they're doing well emotionally and socially. The survey explores heighted levels of stress and asks about common behaviors, like attention, mood, or how a student interacts with others. The implementation of the PSC allows our Student and Family Services team to proactively support students early in the school year, in collaboration with their parent/guardian to ensure they have a successful school year. If your student's responses indicate they may need additional support, a member of the Student and Family Services department will meet with your student and will engage in follow up with the parent/guardian.

HOMECOMING TICKETS

Homecoming 2024 Tickets are available for sale now here on the 5-Star website.

We are excited to announce that students and families may begin purchasing tickets to the Homecoming Dance 2024: Under the Sea. The dance will take place in the Maine South Spectator gym on Saturday, September 28th from 7-10pm. Please read carefully for dance entry information and ticket purchasing steps:

Dance Policies

- Students at Maine South High School may bring one outside guest to a social event, provided that the guest form is completed accurately and approved by the Assistant Principals of Student Supports, prior to purchasing a guest ticket. For the homecoming dance, the guest must be a current high school student and present photo identification upon entry.
- Any student entering the dance is subject to search.
- Students must arrive no later than 8pm to gain admittance to the dance. (Exceptions may be made for athletic participation)
- All students must pre-purchase tickets. No sales will be accepted at the door.

GUEST APPROVAL PROCESS

- Students must submit a guest approval form to their Student Support Team (SST) desk. Guest forms can be printed from the following link or obtained from their SST team desk. **FORM HERE**
- The form must be returned to their SST desk no later than Wednesday, September 25 @ 3:30pm *no submissions will be accepted after this date*
- Once the form has been received and processed, your student will receive a confirmation email from Mr. Edwards, notifying them that they may purchase their guest ticket.
- Guest tickets must be purchased by the cutoff time listed on the 5 Star website.
- If both students are Maine South students, you do not need to submit a guest form, and may log into the 5-Star site, enter the other student's ID and last name to purchase their ticket.

SHOW YOUR HAWK P.R.I.D.E

Be RESILIENT! Our Hawk P.R.I.D.E. framework represents the skills and competencies we commit to developing in our students to support them as Maine South students and beyond.

R represents RESILIENT. Students are resilient when they use strategies to problem solve, and demonstrate perseverance and a positive attitude even when faced with challenges. Rather than getting discouraged by mistakes, resilient students see them as part of the learning process. Resilient students also ask for help when needed, showing strength in seeking support from peers, teachers, or resources.

Many resources are available for students at Maine South should they need additional academic support. Our Academic Resource Center (ARC) is staffed by English, Mathematics, and Science staff during all periods and before and after school for drop-in help. Peer tutors are available in the ARC from 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM (provided tutors are available during a given time/class period). Additionally, teachers are typically available Tuesday - Friday from 3:00 - 3:30pm during office hours and by appointment. Caregivers, we encourage you to support your student in taking adv

CALCULATOR USAGE & LOANERS



Calculator Check Out

The TI-84 graphing calculator is an excellent tool for math and science classes and one that is required for most math classes. Students are welcome to purchase their own calculator or they can borrow one from the school for use during the school year.

Things to remember with regards to calculator check out:

- 1. Students may keep the calculator for the entire school year. Calculators will be collected at the end of the school year.
- 2. Students are responsible for the specific calculator that is checked out to them.

When returning the calculator, the number on the back of the calculator must match the one that was checked out to the student.

- 1. Students should keep track of their own calculators. If a student believes their calculator may have been switched with someone else's, they can visit the Chrome Depot to have it scanned and confirm ownership. It is the student's responsibility to retrieve their calculator if there is a mix-up.
- 2. Failure to return the specific calculator checked out by the student will result in an obligation equal to the replacement fee of the calculator.
- 3. Students are responsible for purchasing their own batteries, which are not provided by the school nor sold at the bookstore.






