Several Maine South seniors have earned recognition from the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. Students achieved their status based on their performance on the PSAT taken in their junior year of high school.

Each year, the National Merit Scholarship Corporation uses the SAT scores of some 1.3 million program entrants to determine recognition. The top $50,\!000$ scores are used for semifinalist and commended status. Of those entrants, less than 1% (only the top $16,\!000$ of the high scorers) qualify as semifinalists with the opportunity to advance to Merit Scholarship awards. The remaining $34,\!000$ qualify for commended status.

Semifinalists can advance to the finalist level of the competition and earn one of three types of scholarships:

- One of 2,500 National Merit \$2,500 Scholarships. Winners of this scholarship receive a single payment of \$2,500.
- A corporate-sponsored scholarship. Over 100 corporations, company foundations, and businesses sponsor scholarships through the National Merit Program as part of their educational philanthropy. This year, these sponsors committed nearly \$13 million to support Merit Scholarship awards, scholarships for children of their employees, or for other accomplished students who meet the sponsor's criteria.
- A college-sponsored merit scholarship. National Merit Scholarships will be offered to finalists
 who plan to attend a sponsor college or university. Approximately 150 colleges sponsor the
 program.

All Merit Scholar designees are chosen based on their abilities, accomplishments, and potential for success in rigorous college studies without regard to gender, race, ethnic origin, or religious preference.




